* Freshmen that are accepted to the 5-Year Program, will be required to maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher throughout their undergraduate career. Failure to maintain the required grade point average could result in removal from the program and the inability to take graduate courses. Assuming the requirements are met, **students can take up to 3 graduate MCJ courses between the fall and spring semesters of the senior year.**

* Current DeSales criminal justice majors with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher are invited to apply for admittance to the 5-Year Program. Assuming the requirements are met and admittance is granted, **students can take up to 3 graduate MCJ courses between the fall and spring semesters of the senior year; students can also take MCJ courses in the summer following the senior year prior to the start of the fifth year.** Juniors are required to complete a written application, which requires at least two letters of recommendation.

** In addition to the 9 credits taken during the senior year, the MCJ curriculum can be completed online with an additional 21 credits for a total of 30 credits.

MCJ courses taken following graduation will be billed at the MCJ rate at time the course is taken.
